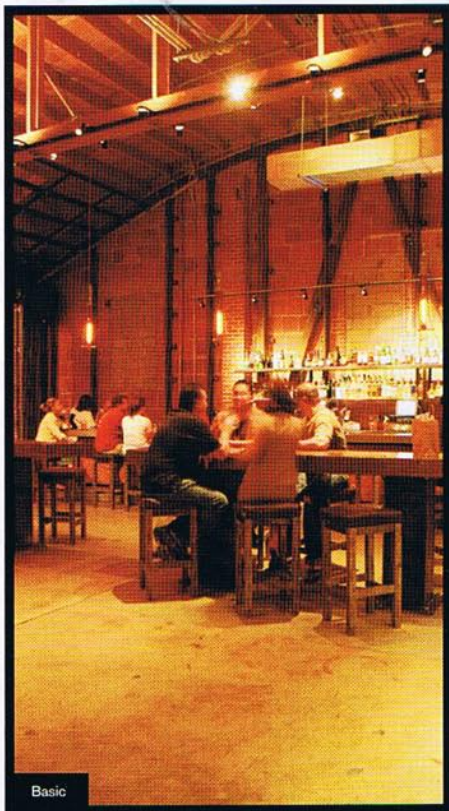
## PLAY
